More national attention for the Montana Meth Project. This time, the White House National Drug Policy Director John Walters visited Great Falls to recognize the campaigns work. John Walters says the state of Montana has been a leader in creating tools to lower the use of methamphetamine. He says much of the praise goes to the Montana Meth Project.

The perceived benefit has decreased dramatically. Eighty percent of young people in the state believe that even one time meth use can cause brain damage. Tom Siebel says with the impact and recognition the Montana Meth Project is receiving, you can expect to see a new campaign every six to nine months.
