**Survey finds fewer teens using meth**

A national survey by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention shows that fewer Montana teens are using methamphetamine.

The 2009 Youth Risk Behavior Survey is given to students in grades eight, 10 and 12. Just over 3 percent of students reported using meth at least once. That's down from 4.6 percent in 2007 and 8.3 percent in 2005.

The survey is conducted every two years.

Attorney General Steve Bullock's office released additional statistics on meth use in the state showing a 62 percent drop in meth-related crime between 2005 and 2008.
